
NMIS Students - our fourth language: Computer Coding!


Our students have loved the addition of Computer Coding as one of our Enrichment classes this year. This is a class, **funded by NMISF**, where kids learn the basics of

This week our students will learn what it means to be reflective. They will learn IB song for being reflective and will sing it every morning this week in class. They will make a group posters about being reflective and will present them to the class. Students will begin working on class book of IB attributes by reflecting on what their favorite attribute is and draw a picture and write how they are that attribute best. Book will sent March 8 for publishing.

In Language Arts, students will begin our unit 9 of Tesoros and will learn the letter "II" and words that begin with this letter. We will also read stories with words that begin with II and write sentences in our notebooks with letter II.

In math we will continue to review subtraction symbol, addition and interrupted counts.Students will also practice counting by 5's. In science, students will continue to explore the five senses. Don't forget to practice Raz Kids at home, especially reading Spanish books (levels AA-B) to help prepare your student for our Spanish test AVANT coming up in March!

This week, we will finish our line of inquiry on the states of matter by learning a bit more about plasma. And we will start wrapping up our IB unit theme of How the World Works as we learn about the Scientific Method in our final line of inquiry: How we interpret evidence and information.

Classes will reflect on our inquiries of the states of matter, the sun, and the moon in order to see where we have already applied this method in our classes. Our kids will use body





movements to learn the different terms for stages of the process: observando, preguntando, prediciendo, experimentando, reportando, concluyendo.

We will introduce our summative assessment to get the classes thinking about their final project for the following week: devising and carrying out an experiment outside in our rugged play area east of the school building. Our Spanish vocabulary words are **evidencia**, **información**, **predecir**, **experimentar**, **reportar**, **concluir**. Our English spelling words are **all**, **wall**, **call**, **will**, **tell**, **well**, **small**, **smell**, **yell**. In math, we will review Unit 7 and our exploration of geometry before taking the unit assessment. Students will review 2-dimensional shapes of pattern blocks and sort them into groups according to common attributes like sides and corners. We will also revisit attributes of polygons and play games to review the names of 3-dimensional shapes.

In IB we will continue "How do we express ourselves". Our second graders will be learning about different ways people have expressed themselves through poetry, song, music, plays, art and dance.

This week in Math, students will continue in Unit 8. This unit focuses on fractions. We will continue doing multiplication and division problems in this unit. In Social Studies, our students will learn about how people express themselves through plays. Students will continue to practice a play and will learn about the different roles needed to produce a play. Sra. De Lilla's class will present a play on Ruby Bridges and Sra. Lopez's class will present a play on Harriet Tubman. We will also learn about how people express themselves through dance.

The students will continue improving their spelling, penmanship, and writing skills through dictation.
