Our Family Handbook states that children with a "strong or persistent" cough are to **remain home from school.** This is because a cough is a symptom of <u>something</u> - it could be a virus, a respiratory infection or it could be allergies or asthma.

For these two latter cases, please be sure your child has an *Allergy Action Plan* or an *Asthma Action Plan* on file with with the Health Office. If your child presents with a cough and has


such a plan, the school can act accordingly to help the child.

If your child does not have such a plan, or if your child does have such a plan but the cough is not responsive to the treatment indicated in the plan, your child will be sent home for the day. This is simply in an effort to help keep all our students healthy on campus.

Stay Home if You Have Pink Eye

Conjunctivitis or "Pink Eye," can be extremely contagious, and is spread by contact with eye secretions from someone who is infected.

Symptoms include redness, itching, and tearing of the eyes. It can also lead to discharge or crusting around the eyes.



Allergic conjunctivitis

can be treated with antihistamines. Bacterial conjunctivitis can be treated with antibiotic eye drops. If you are aware that your child is infected, please make sure that they are on antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school.

AVANT Language Acquisition Tests: 22 March - 19 April

K-5th: All students begin taking the AVANT **Spanish** assessment **this week**. This test is designed for students learning Spanish as a second language and measures their progress in up to four areas.

- Kinder: Listening and Speaking
- First Grade: Listening, Speaking and Reading
- Second through 5th Grade: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.

It is important your child is present for these exams. Your teacher can give you the specific dates and times.

4th & 5th: Students in these grade levels will take the AVANT Arabic assessment. Arabic assessments begin next week. These are similar to the Spanish versions, but measure their Arabic development in Listening and Reading. It is important your child is present for these exams. First Grade

This week we will begin our second line of inquiry in our Sharing the Planet unit: the relationships among tools, force, and movement. The vocabulary words related to this week's learning are *relación*, *fuerza*, *movimiento*, *gravedad*, *jalar* and *empujar*. Our English spelling words are **saw**, **paw**, **law**, **lawn**, **fawn**, **then**, **this**, **what**, **new**.

This inquiry will focus on how forces influence the movement of our bodies and the tools humans have developed over time to help us in our daily lives. This line of inquiry will culminate next week in the development and creation of our own vehicles!

In math, we will continue to explore the concepts of fractions and division, and will then take our Unit 8 assessment. We'll begin Unit 9 toward the end of the week, revisiting number patterns on a number grid to specifically identify patterns with ones and tens. Then we'll start using that knowledge as a





tool to more quickly add and subtract by tens.

In IB we will begin a new unit "Sharing the Planet". Our second graders will be learning about planets, habitats, nature's recyclers and how we can take care of our planet.

This week in Math, students will begin Unit 10. This unit focuses on working on area, perimeter and money. We will continue to work on multiplication facts.

In Social Studies, our students will learn about the arctic and tundra. Students will begin to work on a group project on how pollution and contamination affect our habitats.

In science we will learn about Mars, Jupiter and Saturn. Students will choose a planet to research and complete a Bloom Ball. During this unit students will also work on a project to research an animal of their choice.

The students will continue improving their spelling, penmanship, and writing skills through dictation. Different areas of the Earth are home to different animals. The animals and plants that live in each habitat are adapted to cope with the conditions around them. Many habitats have been destroyed by human activity.




