School-Wide Updates

Kinder - Fifth Grade Registration 2019-2020

This article is only for families coming back to NMIS next year in

grades K-5: The time is upon us! We will soon begin registration for the upcoming school year. For students in K-5th grade for 2019-2020, this year this process will be significantly different. Instead of paper/hard copy registration forms, you will register your child for NMIS via an online portal called ParentVUE. This will be a much more efficient process, but, like all new processes, there will be some hiccups as we launch it.

Registration for K-5 2019-2020 will begin on 24 April 2019 and end on 29 July 2019. It is

imperative that you complete your registration during this period -

including your immunization requirements. If, on the date registration closes, you are missing any component of your registration, you will forfeit your enrollment for your child.

To complete this registration, you will receive an email with an activation key code from

Albuquerque Public Schools (this is the agency from whom we are purchasing this registration

software). **Do not delete this** email.

To assist in this new process, we will host **Registration Support Sessions.** We will have computers set-up and NMIS personnel on site to help navigate you through this. These Registration Support Sessions are Wednesdays from 2pm - 5pm on the following dates:

Incoming sixth grade families will complete registration via a paper/hard copy registration packet. This packet will be sent via email by 15 April 2019 and will be due 10 May 2019. Please be sure the packet is complete by the due date so we can plan our 6th grade accordingly!

Last Library Day



The NMIS library will close for the school year on Wednesday, 17 **April 2019.** This will allow our volunteer library crew to inventory our collection.

By Friday, 10 May, the library will run a list of children with outstanding books. If your child is on this list, he/she will not be permitted to participate in end-of year activities, such as: Spring violin concert, water day, graduation ceremonies, or any classroom parties.



Volunteer Labor for OUR <u>BIG</u> MOVE!

We are gathering lists of volunteers to help in our transition to our new campus. We need help in the following areas:

Move-Out Crew: This group of volunteers will go through our current campus after the moving company has moved out all our stuff. Their role will be to patch holes in walls and do a general clean up of the building so we can better anticipate a full refund of our security deposit from our current landlord. This work will be done between 26 June - 30 June.

New Campus Prep Crew: This group of volunteers will do things in

our new campus that won't be done by our new landlord. The specifics of this are yet to be determined, but will likely include painting and basic handi(wo)man work, such as mounting heavy items to walls. This work will be done between **29 July -2 August.**

Move-In Crew: This group of volunteers will be responsible for moving things into our classrooms. When the moving company moves our belongings into the new campus, they will mostly be placed in a staging area in the new gymnasium. This is because the classrooms at that point will likely not be ready for occupancy, and we will need a place to store our stuff until the rooms are ready. Once the rooms are ready, we will need assistance moving things from the staging area into the classrooms. This work will be done 12 August -16 August.

This Week's Grade-by-Grade **Update**

Kindergarten

This week students will continue to learn about the environment and about inventions made to help clean the air, ocean, waters and decrease deforestation using wind as an alternative energy source. They will make a collage of inventions that help the environment using wing energy. Students will continue to brainstorm new ideas/inventions they could create to help the environment.

Students will bring a picture or drawing of a current invention using wind energy as their energy source. We will make a class poster with the pictures students bring so make sure that your student participates in this activity by bringing their picture this week. Students will share how this invention uses wind as their source of energy and how it helps improve the environment so make sure to discuss this with your child before they bring their picture to class.

In Language Arts students will be reviewing letter /c/ and learn to identify what vowels (a,o,u) that make the strong sound of c (k sound) and which vowels (e and i) that make the soft sound of (s) doing activities tied to these letters. Students will continue to work on listening comprehension activities to prepare them for AVANT. Students will be taking the listening section of AVANT this week so have them practice for this using Razkids, listening and reading books in Spanish at their level.

In math, students will practice making and interpreting graphs doing a variety of activities even class based surveys where they will have to make a graphs with the answers they gather. For example one of the activities will consist of students identifying how many kids bring red, blue or yellow uniform shirts and will make a graph of their result and then interpret their results in a graph format.

In Science, students will learn about Wind Energy by doing a variety of hands-on activities from our science kits.

This week, our class will prepare for our summative assessment in our Sharing the Planet Unit. Students will prepare and write a letter to Governor Martinez to share what they know about some of our state's natural resources and what they are used for, and then outline ways that they hope the state will care for those resources. Students will present these letters and their ideas to the rest of the class before sending the letters to Santa Fe.

Our Spanish vocabulary words this week will are escribir, pedir, conservar, cuidar, ético, and naturaleza. In English, we have graduated from our spelling words book! This week we will begin introducing new spelling words in the context of vocabulary and grammar skills.

We will enhance our thinking about sharing the planet with other living beings on our field trip to Popejoy Hall on Thursday, where we will see the play "Me...Jane—The Adventures of Young Jane Goodall."

In math, we will do some general review by exploring capacity, symmetry, and heights in more depth. We will then look more at fractional parts of the whole, compare fractions, and introduce the idea of equivalent fractions.

In IB we will continue a unit on "Sharing the Planet". Our second graders will be learning about planets, habitats, nature's recyclers and how we can take care of our planet.

This week in Math, students will begin Unit 10. This unit focuses on working on area, perimeter and money. We will continue to work on multiplication facts.

In Social Studies, our students will learn about nature's recyclers. Students will begin to work on a group project on how pollution and contamination affect our habitats.

In science we will learn about Pluto and Stars. Students will choose a planet to research and complete a Bloom Ball. During this unit students will also work on a project to research an animal of their choice.

The students will continue improving their spelling, penmanship, and writing skills through dictation. Different areas of the Earth are home to different animals. The animals and plants that live in each habitat are adapted to cope with the conditions around them. Many habitats have been destroyed by human activity.

As our investigation into "Sharing the Planet" continues to evolve, students are getting deeper into the "World Peace Game" this week. They will finalize what types of governments their countries have as well as whether they have a president, a dictator, or a queen, etc...as a leader. Based on the geography of their countries, groups will also have to identify their food sources, or lack thereof. Countries will face a food shortage. They will have to problem solve how to save their people from starvation. It looks like some may have to seek help from the UN! Additionally, in Spanish, students will orally defend their #1 pick out of the top four world problems they identified, to the rest of the class.

In science, students are exploring chemical reactions and the different states of matter.

In math, students are studying percentages. Students will be asked to develop a weekly meal plan based on a percentage of an imaginary weekly salary. They will also be taxed for foods they choose to buy that are high in sugar or salt, or that are considered luxury items.

Students will continue to read the BFG in Spanish and will be responsible for at least one literacy circle job.


