There have been some bugs to work out as you navigate this process. If you are having trouble, please "save" your progress and wait until Wednesday, 8 May 2019 and resume the process. We have been told that most of these issues will be solved by then.

ParentVUE is part of a larger "Student Information System" called *Synergy* to which all APS charter schools will convert over the next few years. In the end, this will be a great move, promoting communication between us for student transfers, etc. But there have been hiccups in this transition.

Remember only K-5 did this process this year. Sixth grade registered via "old school" paper/pencil registration forms. Next year, as 7th graders, you'll go through ParentVUE, but by then all the kinks will be ironed out!

This Week's Grade-by-Grade Update

Kindergarten

This week we will wrap up our unit of "How the World Works." Our students will continue practicing presenting their invention posters in class and will be evaluated by the end of this week. We will review with our students through a variety of writing and speaking activities what students have learned about inventions, the invention process, the attributes exercised during this unit from the learner profile and our central idea as we wrap up this unit.

In Language Arts students will be learning about the letter x and y, will learn words that begin with these letters and will do other writing activities. We will also review syllables with o.

In math, students will review symmetry and will be introduced to the ½ fraction, learn about the quarter and the \$1 dollar bill. We will also review counting to 100 forward and backwards!

In Science, students will review about plants and other related science concepts learned during the unit.

We will begin our end-of-year istation assessments for English reading next week. Maestra's

Pedrotty's class will be the only kinder class testing this week next Tuesday. Please make sure to review English phonics and reading at home to prepare them for this test.

This week, we will continue with our final line of inquiry in our unit theme of Where We Are in Place and Time, which is "the features of maps and timelines." During big book read alouds, we will learn about map keys, symbols, directions, and using landmarks to follow directions.

Read-aloud books like Yo en el mapa will give us a framework to understand the concentric circles concept of home, neighborhood, city, state, country, continent, and world.

We'll also take a look at different types of maps, and if you have any at home that you'd like to send in

for your child to present, please feel free to do so!

Our Spanish vocabulary words are mapa, clave, rosa, calle, continente, mundo. Our English spelling words are book, good, look, took, take, read, think, work.

In math, we will review place value and graph-reading, as well as making change, before taking out Unit 10 assessment.

We are also excited for the classes to show what they have learned this year during the violin concert on Friday. They have developed their skills so much this year!


